Introduction to Youth Development (3 units)

LEARNING RESOURCES – LRNRE 048

Survey of the issues and best practices in after school programs. Special emphasis is placed on understanding youth development theories & practices, identification of quality youth development programs; nomenclature of the field; understanding cultural competency.

Introduction to Tutoring (1 unit)

LEARNING RESOURCES – LRNRE 030

Introduction to the methods of effective tutoring: Responsibilities, techniques, learning styles and strategies, study skills, subject area skills.

Occupational Work Experience (2 units)

COOPERATIVE EDUCATION – COPED # to be determined

The Occupational Work Experience class makes it possible for a student to obtain college credit for paid or volunteer experience. During regular semesters, students must enroll in a minimum of seven units including Cooperative Work Experience Education.

First Aid and Safety (2 units)

HEALTH EDUCATION - HLTED 009

Development of skills and knowledge for immediate and temporary care in case of an accident or sudden illness; preventive measures.
